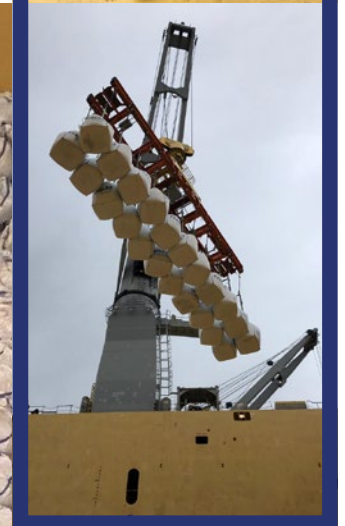


Sand Adventure

Fracht is reaching out and taking on new territory!

Fracht has teamed up with Shale Support in a new and exciting strategic partnership that will help both companies expand their footprint. Shale Support is a leading provider of frac sand and logistical solutions to the oil and gas proppant market. In mid-February, Fracht USA, in collaboration with **Fracht Argentina**, loaded 15,000 tons of sand (roughly 10,000 bags!) onto a vessel headed for the Vaca Muerta Shale in Argentina. This was the first move of its kind for Fracht USA. This incredible milestone is an exciting step for **Fracht** as we enter into new territory and continue to show the world what we are capable of!

Exciting Airfreight

Houston to Ecuador

On February 8th, in the early hours of the day, division 14 in Houston chartered an MD-11 Freighter from Houston to Quito, Ecuador. Fracht was contacted by a target customer to move an urgent quantity of hazardous and corrosive material that was urgently needed in Ecuador. After reaching out to 3 forwarders - Fracht was chosen to be the one to make this quick move! We chartered a Skylease MD-11 into Houston and loaded up 15 ULD's of the product. It touched down at the destination airport later that day with no issues. No matter how big or small- we can do it all!

Double Antonov

On the 23rd of December, Fracht successfully loaded not one, but TWO Antonov AN-124's, the second largest cargo aircraft in the world. With over 188,000 kilos of cargo, the two aircrafts were required in order to ship the generator, turbine and other parts from the Czech Republic & Poland to its final destination in Georgia. Once in Georgia, Fracht formulated a solution via rail to get the cargo to the final destination whilst avoiding the 4-6 week wait for road permits. This alternative solution resulted in the customer receiving their cargo before years end! As they say, two is better than one!

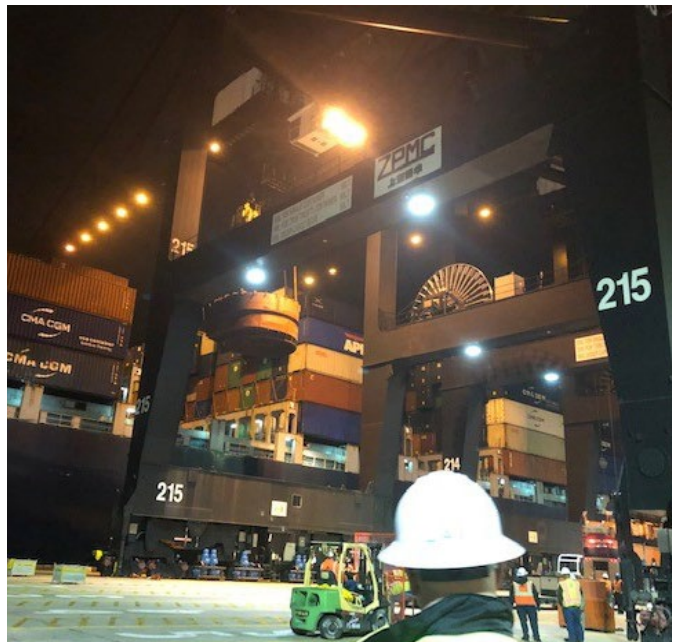

Shanghai to Hannibal Project

Fracht Miami started 2019 with a bang! They were tasked with moving a Cyclone Mill plant. The project was composed of 6 Break Bulk over dimensional pieces, totaling 573 cubic meters from the port of Shanghai to the Port of Houston with its final door delivery in Hannibal Missouri USA. The pieces left the port of Shanghai on December 25th and arrived in Houston on January 22nd. During the ocean transit time, Fracht Miami coordinated the entire logistics to have the project pre-cleared US customs and directly discharged from the vessel to the trucks that were scheduled to deliver the cargo into the final site in Hannibal. The final delivery date was January 29th, exactly 16 days prior to the required deadline! Congratulations to Fracht Miami for quickly and efficiently pulling off this move!



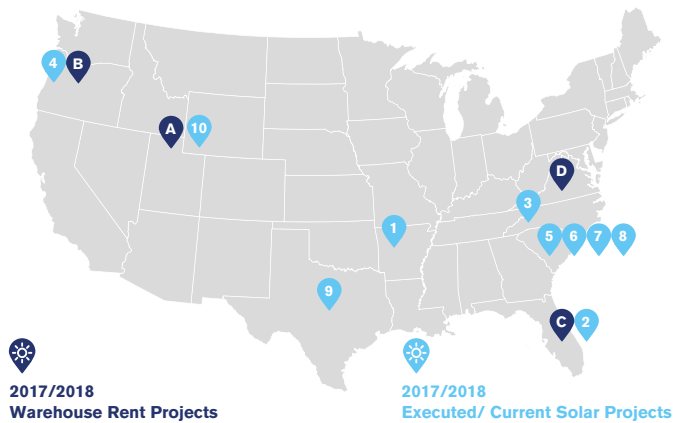
Solar Initiative

Fracht's solar initiative began in late 2017, with an inquiry to store over 300,000 solar panels in less than a 1 month time period. Fracht made it happen and has since been on the rise dramatically in the solar industry. We have 10 ongoing solar projects all across the US and expect more in 2019. Fracht continues to go the extra mile for our customers! The Solar Team continues to work with both the General Cargo and Projects divisions to guarantee top notch service for all of our customers, from dedicated personnel to ample warehouse space- we at Fracht are excited and ready to see where this continues to take us!

Solar Warehouses- Fracht now manages 4 warehouses across the country, totaling at nearly 600,000 sq. ft. of warehouse space! 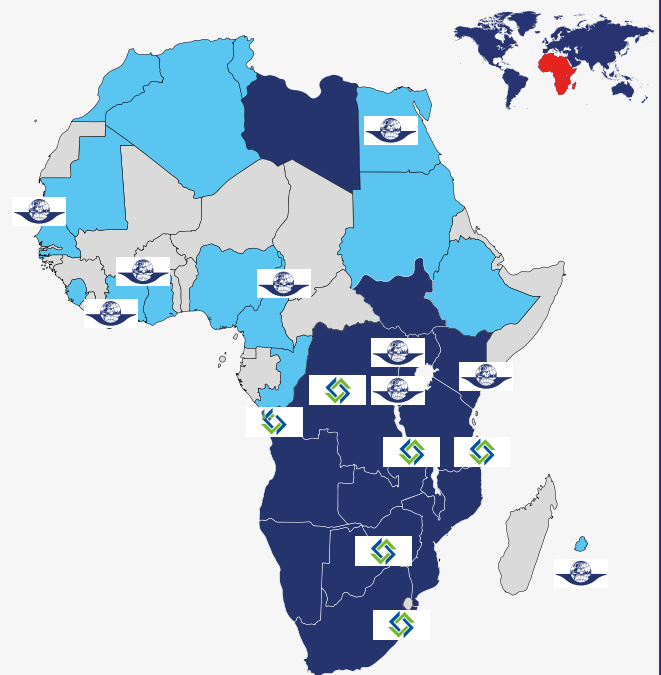

Helping Where We Can

What better way to kick off our new mission of aid & relief than by giving to those in need? Just last week, Fracht participated in a charity event to give back to children struggling with medical issues in Venezuela.

On March 23rd, a group of Venezuelan volunteers from Houston gathered for an unforgettable day with the Luz Para Venezuela (“Light for Venezuela”) campaign, where Fracht USA presented a donation of nearly \$3,000 for BANDA ZUL. BANDA ZUL is a nonprofit organization created by a group of former classmates living all over the world. It was created in July of 2016, and its sole purpose is to educate and assist in improving the quality of life of individuals in Venezuela suffering from illnesses by offering knowledge and medical resources that enhance their self-care abilities.

Thousands of children in Venezuela will be receiving these donations, along with medication, first aid kits, diapers, baby formula and canned foods, totaling 34 boxes that will be shipped to Venezuela this week.
